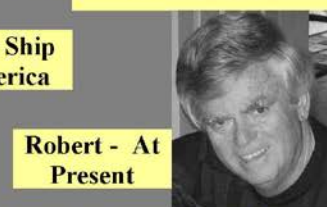

The Shoah Quilt of Memory

Over four hundred people were present on Sunday, May 4th as Sinai Temple's Rabbi David Wolpe consecrated our Mount Sinai Shoah Quilts during our 2008 Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day Observance. Each square in the Quilt shares a personal statement of remembrance and reflection of a Holocaust survivor, family,

friends or a community member. At the Observance, we were also privileged to preview an original documentary featuring first person stories of loss, rescue and survival as told by the Quilt square creators.

Lending musical expression to this day of remembrance were Sinai Temple's Cantor Joseph Gole and the Long Beach Opera Company, which presented selections from "The Diary of Anne Frank." Representatives from more than 30

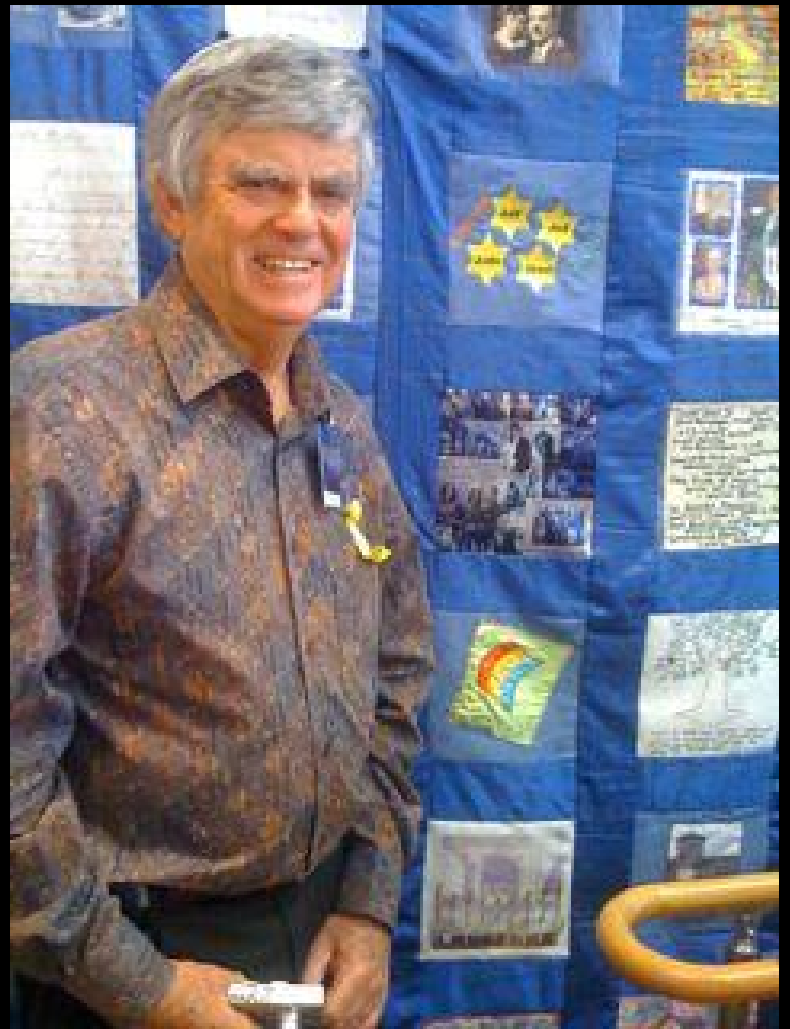
countries were invited to place memorial stones in the Grove of the Righteous Rescuers to recognize the courage of their citizens who saved lives during the Holocaust.

In the near future, Mount Sinai anticipates taking these Quilts, along with the original documentary, to our community temples, organizations and other places.

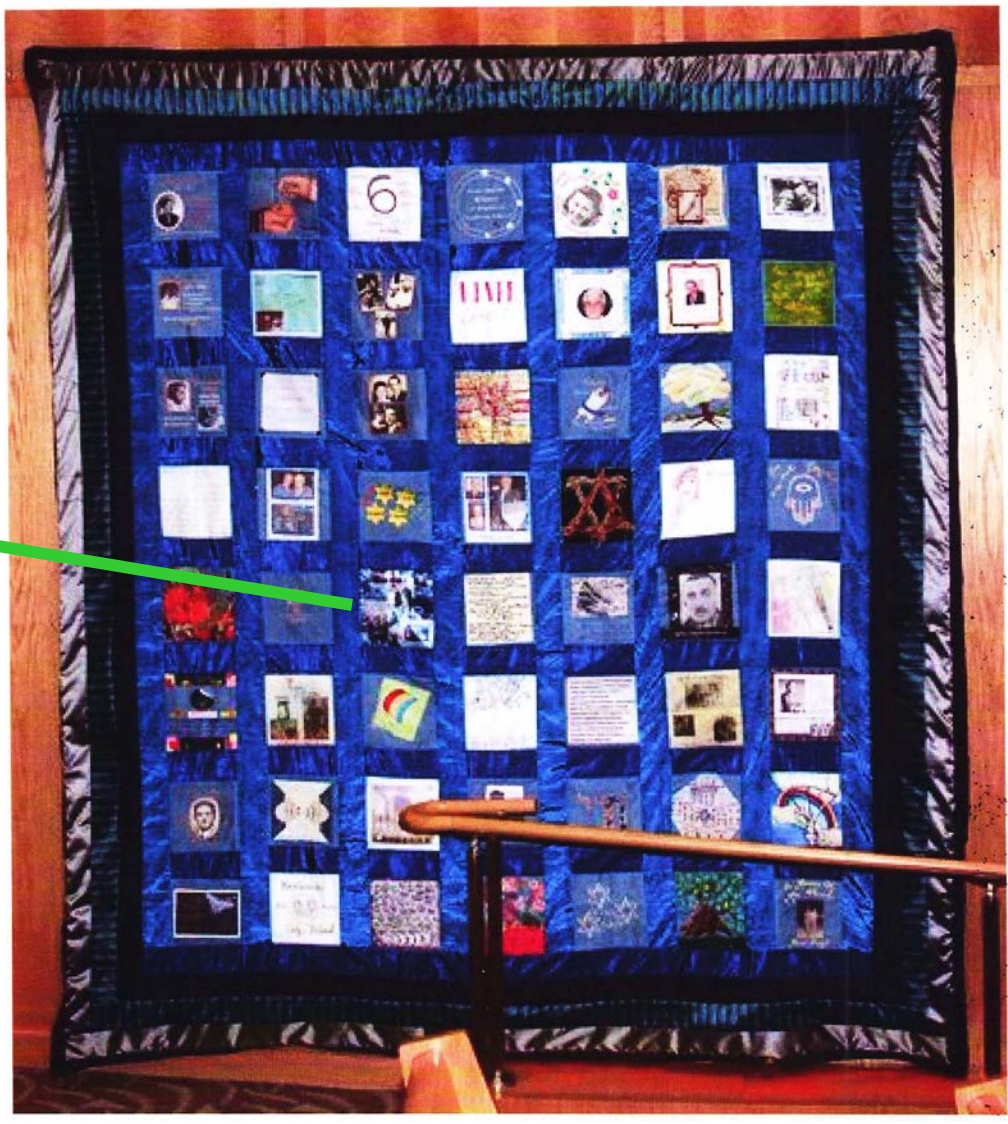
